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## 1) Abilene A&M University Mothers' Club

We have 40 members enrolled for 2015-2016.

This year we will award two \$1000 scholarships to students in our area as well as ten \$100 Barnes and Nobles bookstore scholarships. We will donate \$100 to five student organizations; these organizations will be picked by a general vote from the membership in April. Organizations that have been recipients on the past are: Fish Camp, Corp of Cadets General Scholarship, Carpool, Breakaway and Impact.

Graduating seniors are honored with a ring crest with his/her year of graduation. We provide "goodie bags" (restaurant gift cards) to students during finals of the fall and spring semesters.

In July we hosted the annual "Howdy" party, inviting prospective students and their moms to hear about our club and help answer questions. Each month we have former Aggies from our community come and speak about his/her A&M experiences as a student as well as the TAMU impact they continue to feel as a former student.

In December we had an annual Christmas ornament exchange in the home of current member.

Our biggest fundraiser each year is our boutique raffle for our "apartment set up". We sell \$1 tickets for a chance to win over \$750 of apartment necessities: dishes, towels, silverware, toaster, rugs just to mention a few- all with a Maroon and White flair!

## 2) Amarillo Aggie Moms' Club

Special Events:

- \*We always host an ice cream social in a park at the end of July to welcome new freshmen and their parents and as a time of fellowship with all other Aggie students and parents.
- \* We always host a Christmas break Aggie dinner at a local restaurant for our Aggie students and their families. This year our guest speaker was Todd Pratt, class of 1998. Todd was born and raised in Amarillo and graduated from Amarillo High School and Texas A&M. Upon graduation he went to work for the Green Bay Packers and Seattle Sea Hawks as an athletic trainer. Todd currently lives in Amarillo and is going through Denver Seminary at Hillside Christian Church.

#### 3) Angelina County A&M Mothers' Club

The Angelina County A&M Mothers' Club currently has 53 members.

Our annual dinner fundraiser event was held on February 2, 2016 with close to 400 people in attendance. Benjamin Knox Gallery donated a print, and local Aggies donated basketball tickets and a framed painting for silent auction items. All proceeds will benefit our scholarship program.

Our scholarship applications for the 2016-17 year are due on April 11, 2016 and will be awarded in May; last year we awarded 11 scholarships totaling \$9,350.00 to Angelina County students attending Texas A&M.

In August, we held our annual Back to School Party; new and returning A&M students from Angelina County were invited along with their parents, former students, and other family members. New students were given a 12<sup>th</sup> Man towel, and returning students were given an A&M spiral notebook. Dinner was served, and State Representative Trent Ashby '96 was the guest speaker. Each student in attendance introduced themselves, and returning students gave information pertaining to any student organization they are affiliated with and answered guestions for the new students.

# 7) Austin County A & M University Mothers' Club

We look forward to another great year supporting Texas A&M University, the A&M Students and the Aggie Moms.

### 17) Comal County TAMU Mothers Club

The Comal county Texas A&M University Mothers' Club was founded in 1953 with 19 members. This year marks our 62<sup>nd</sup> anniversary with 109 members. Our club is one of the oldest clubs in Texas and has a proud and strong tradition of service to Texas A&M and Aggies everywhere.

Our club began the 2015-2016 season with a Howdy Ice Cream Social in August where we hosted all local incoming freshman Aggies and their families. At this Social, we awarded 4 scholarships to current A&M seniors from Comal County valued at \$1,000 each. Spring scholarships recipients were recognized as we awarded 12 scholarships valued at \$1,000 each and 4 alternate scholarships at \$500 each in April of 2015. Our Spring Picnic hosted the TX A&M Traditions Counsel. They were a wealth of knowledge. Comal County Aggie Moms also have an endowed scholarship that provides a scholarship to a freshman each year.

In May of 2015, our club donated \$400 to each of the following TX A&M Organizations: 1. Aggie Shields 2. Evans Library 3. Parsons Mounted Cavalry 4. Carpool 5. Patriot Paws.

Comal County Aggie Mom members were represented as a delegation in attendance at the Fall Federation meeting, Aggie Moms Camp, Winter Federation meeting, and District 8 meeting.

Every year we take orders, mix, bake and package five kinds of German cookies to fund our scholarships. It is a monumental effort held the second weekend in December, and we use the entire commercial kitchen and

cafeteria at a local high school. It takes approximately 48 hours to complete this undertaking. On that Sunday afternoon, more than 24,000 cookies were packed by our club members and picked up by the happy customers. This year marked the 61<sup>st</sup> anniversary of our Comal County Aggie Mom Cookie Bake.

We are in our 4<sup>th</sup> year of producing authentic German steins for our Boutique contribution. We have a new design each year making it a desirable item to build upon as a collection. The proceeds from the stein sales go for scholarships.

We held our annual February Family Dinner night at a local (owned by an Aggie Dad) Mexican Food restaurant, which was very well attended. This event gives Aggie Moms an opportunity to mingle with other Aggie Mom families in a non-business setting.

This spring we plan to offer our steins at Parents Weekend Boutique, and our club president will present the Commandant's Flag to the most involved corps outfit. This award signifies the outfit that gives the most back to the community.

In April we will participate in our local general TAMU Club's Muster event by providing all the desserts for the attendees. Also in April we will have our Scholarship Picnic where we will present scholarships to several deserving incoming Aggie Freshmen.

## 18) Dallas County

2015 – 2016 has been a great year for the Dallas County Aggie Moms' Club! We began in May with our Installation dinner at Aggie-owned Tupinamba Café with several brand new Club members in attendance. We were privileged to have Katie Latham, our District 2 Liaison, install the new officers. She conducted the ceremony in true Aggie fashion, reminding each officer of her duties and explaining each position using A&M terminology.

I chose "All of Us Are Greater Than Any of Us" as my theme to emphasize that the collective effort of a group can accomplish more than any single individual. I made an effort to meet with each officer in May and early June to review their plans of work for the upcoming year before a New Board Workshop in June. I compiled a new notebook for each officer and included a jump drive with scanned copies of all recent notebooks for that position along with electronic versions of all necessary forms and files. Each officer inherited a DCAM Gmail account corresponding to the office that she will pass on to her successor.

Our Howdy Party, a joint venture with Collin County, was a huge success with over 200 families participating. We were fortunate enough to have 'hometown' Yell Leaders and their attending family members added to the festivities. We also had a packed house at our New Moms Social.

We changed the location of our General Meetings this year, partially because the Texas A&M AgriLife Center's Pavilion was scheduled for demolitions and partially to see if we could garner more attendance (we did). My goal for the Programs at our General Meetings was to provide one school-oriented program, one non-school but still Aggie-oriented and one purely social theme for each semester. We encouraged Aggie Dads to attend the Aggie-oriented programs and Chili Cook-off (January), and in February we invited past Presidents to attend to celebrate Mrs. Peoples and all of the others who have continued the Aggie Mom legacy since we were established in 1922. We kicked off the year with New Student and Family Programs (Student Life) and will end with the A&M Recruitment Center and a Moms' Panel to address questions for incoming freshman and transfer moms. In between, we welcomed the 12<sup>th</sup> Man Foundation to talk about the new Kyle Field and planned sports venues, Rusty Burson to talk about Aggie Sports and the Traditions Council to remind of us of what makes A&M special. We also reintroduced the practice of inviting new graduates to the meeting following graduation so we can present them with gift and celebrate their accomplishment (January and May).

Our fundraising efforts included Boutique sales at selected meetings, Aggie Mom Camp and the Winter Federation meeting (and upcoming Parents' Weekend) in addition to our Howdy Holiday Sale where we invited participation by other surrounding Aggie Moms Clubs. We sold SCRIP all year and held several shopping

evenings with Rally House and Kendra Scott. The highlight was hosting the Singing Cadets in Concert at the Dallas City Performance Hall.

We renewed focus in the social area with DCAM offering at least one "Aggie Moms Connecting" event every month beginning in June. The activities ranged from old favorites (bowling, Bunco, bingo, movies, happy hour and dinner) to new ventures (Bush Museum Tour, Pioneer Woman Book Signing. Holiday Sweet Swap, painting the Aggie Barn, wine bottling and Whole Foods tour). The Book Club that was formed last year continued to attract more interest holding a holiday dinner and book swap. We also held Craft Workshops (ornament making, painting, scrapbook assembly and sewing sessions) to build up our Boutique inventory. I'm proud to say that for the first time we will participate in The Big Event working with Hope Supply Co. assembling hygiene boxes for teens.

We tried a new approach to Goody Bags in the fall, making it a meeting activity. The cost of participation was one multi-pack item for each bag packed. We made reusable bags out of t-shirts and let the moms take them for 'delivery' at Thanksgiving. We made over 40 bags, exceeding the total number sold in recent years. Our Aggies loved them! We will follow the same format for the spring with a couple of moms taking them to A&M for distribution.

The Club currently has a total membership of 144 including active, life and associate members. We will continue to provide two Endowed Scholarships and five additional scholarships to a freshman, sophomore, Junior, Senior and Corps member (any level). We will present one Corps award to the Outstanding Cadet Staff Officer. Additional donations totaling \$10,000 were made to 63 student organizations determined by our membership.

We had dedicated Officers, and many of them attended the fall and Winter Federation Meetings and Workshops with me. Additionally, I had the support of several of our recent past Presidents; I value their strong leadership and all of their advice and guidance. It was an honor to serve this year.

#### 19) Deep East Texas A&M Mothers' Club

The Deep East Texas Aggie Moms' Club hosted the Singing Cadets in January 2015 and were given the opportunity through one of our associate members, Cathy Stringer, to have Gene Stallings, former "Junction Boy" from Texas A&M and coach of his alma mater before coaching for St. Louis/Phoenix Cardinals and The University of Alabama to speak in April 2016. From these events, we were able to raise the money for our scholarships. We gave two \$500 scholarships to students from two local high schools entering as freshmen at Texas A&M in Fall 2015. In addition, we gave four \$500 scholarships to current upperclassmen at Texas A&M from our local area, including the annual Bobby Smith Engineering Scholarship, given to an upper division engineering major at Texas A&M. These were awarded at our annual scholarship and recognition dinner last May. We also started a new tradition at this event by creating an honorary member title. Our first honorary member is Iva Holyfield, an Aggie mom and former club officer who has been active in our club for many, many years. In addition, our club was happy to give back to Texas A&M by donating \$150 to Carpool, \$200 to 12<sup>th</sup> can Food Bank, and \$150 to the Big Event.

In June 2015, we had our annual Howdy Hullabaloo. We had an ice cream sundae bar and invited incoming students and their parents from our area as well as current students and their families. Our door prizes included five \$200 book scholarships to Barnes and Noble, as well as numerous other Aggie door prizes. We were delighted to have three of the current Yell Leaders at this kick-off event, and they entertained us with stories and led us in yells. It was a great event to welcome new students and their families into the Aggie family.

Our current year began in September with our annual salad supper to host and welcome new Aggie moms to our club. Our current membership is at 48 active members, 5 associate members, and 1 honorary member.

In October, our club participated in the mini-boutique at Aggie Moms Fish Camp and had lots of fun and raised enough money to fund one scholarship. Several of our moms attended the Fish Camp this year. On that note, one of our moms, Clair Balliet will be the Aggie Mom Fish Camp 2016 Co-Chair. We are honored that Clair

also serves this year on the Federation Board as a member of the By-Laws committee and last year as a member of the Nominating Committee.

In November, we had a special speaker, Geracie Mack, mom of Aggie defensive tackle Daylon Mack, who is from Gladewater. She entertained us with stories of the Aggie football program, her experiences as the mom of a player, and she and her family's enthusiasm for and dedication to Texas A&M.

In December we had our own version of Aggies Give Back: Aggie Moms Give Back. We chose the Women's Center of East Texas, an organization that helps women and children who are victims of domestic violence and sexual assault by providing safe haven and support services. We were able to donate \$600 in gift card donations for the moms to shop for Christmas presents for their children, as well as donating gifts for the moms. In addition, some of our Aggie moms and their Aggies home for Christmas break volunteered at the Center's Christmas party by helping the moms choose and wrap gifts for their children and doing crafts with the kids while their moms were "shopping".

Our members have otherwise been busy preparing and crafting items for the upcoming Aggie Moms Boutique next month at Parent's Weekend.

We also would like to note that this year marks the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our club, which we will celebrate in April. We are thankful for the support of our moms and our community in service to Aggies and Texas A&M. We look forward to many more years of fun and service to come!

20) Denver Aggie Moms' Club Number of Members: 24 Donations to A&M: \$1750

**Fundraising:** Each year our club raises funds through the King Soopers (Kroger) Community Rewards program. Club members and their family and friends reload King Soopers gift cards to purchase groceries and other items at the store. The club received 5% in rewards dollars from the money that was spent to reload these gift cards.

The Galveston County Mothers' Club is unique in that we have a Branch Campus in our backyard. That means that we not only serve the College Station Campus but the Texas A&M University Galveston Campus on Pelican Island as well. Proudly, this Branch Campus is home to one of five Maritime Academy's in the Country, Texas A&M Maritime Academy. ## 23) Greater New Orleans Aggie Moms Club

The Greater New Orleans Aggie Moms Club is made up of moms mainly from the New Orleans and Baton Rouge area. Officers include President, Secretary/Gift Card Chair, Membership Chair and Treasurer. We currently have 24 paid members. We average 10-12 members at each meeting. Our club meetings have been held in September 2015, December 2015, March 2016 and one is scheduled in June 2016. We hosted an Aggie Ornament exchange during our December meeting. We normally meet in member homes or at a local restaurant that supports TAMU events.

We currently have 18 College Station students and 5 Galveston students. We normally send the students of paid members a restaurant gift card in the Fall and the Spring. This year we are also sending a gift card for the student's birthday. Graduating students receive a free Benjamin Knox print.

Our only current fundraiser is selling Benjamin Knox prints at the Boutique during Parent's Weekend. We were able to fund three (3) \$500 student scholarships for the Spring semester. We are considering publishing a 2<sup>nd</sup> Greater New Orleans Aggie Moms Cookbook and possibly developing a cookbook APP. We are fortunate to have the New Orleans A&M Club (former students) to financially support us in other areas than scholarships, e.g., birthday gift cards.

During Spring Break this year, a group from TAMU came to the New Orleans to serve at a local no-kill animal shelter. Our club will hosted a dinner one night for the students. Our club collects Mardi Gras beads for the Orange County Aggie Moms Club to use during their annual dinner for the Ross Volunteers.

Due to limited financial resources, we have not made any recent donations to TAMU student organizations. We are trying to organize social events for the students called "Round-Up." Our attempt over the Winter break was unsuccessful and will try again during Parent's Weekend. This is an opportunity for the students from our area to meet each other.

Our normal means of communication is email to our moms. We also have a Facebook page to post upcoming meetings, events, etc.

## 24) Guadalupe County Aggie Moms

During the summer, our officers met to plan for the coming year, setting goals and calendaring events. Our first meeting was in August and we publicized it by putting in in our local papers' community calendar and on radio community calendar, as well as emailing our membership and putting it on our facebook page. We also sent personal invitations to all the new Aggie Moms in our area that we could identify.

Our August meeting turned out great and we had more new moms show up than ever before at an August meeting. Our September meeting was similarly large! At this time, we have 52 dues paid members, which is the highest number we have had in recent memory. At all or most of our meetings we have a "brag" and/or introduction time where we go around the room and have each mom introduce herself and tell a little about her

Aggie student(s). Sometime we skip this if we are short on time, but we try to at least introduce ourselves each meeting.

We also have a meal at each meeting at no cost to the members. Our first meeting, the meal was provided by the officers, and then we have a sign up with 4-5 volunteers to bring a light meal for each meeting. It works wonderfully and there is always more than enough food. We have meals like soups and cornbread with tea, water and dessert, or various salads, or lasagna, salad, bread and desserts. The club provides the paper goods and tea and water each meeting.

At our initial meetings in Aug and Sept, we have sign-up sheets go around for moms to sign up for meals, as well as other events or responsibilities that we need help with throughout the year, such as sending holiday and birthday cards to our students, helping organize our fundraisers, etc.

In August we had a panel discussion, sort of, where certain moms were designated to discuss or take questions re. a particular item of interest for moms of college students or things about our club—such as tutoring, meal plans, football tickets, our food committees, our Howdy Dinner fundraiser, scholarships, parking tickets in College Station, etc. This was our first time to do this and it seemed to work well and encourage discussion between the new and seasoned moms about things that we do or that concern us related to our students.

In September we really just had a business/planning meeting for the year. The last two years we have also participated in a local adult spelling bee by having a team from our Aggie Moms club; this event is usually in the fall. In October, each year, we paint wooden ornaments that we use to decorate a Christmas tree in our town square in Seguin. We have maroon fish for freshman, maroon gig'em hands for sophomores, gold ring crest ovals for juniors and elephants for seniors, as well as a Texas flag design for grad students. The moms pay \$5 for these and often order more than one. One goes on the tree downtown during the holiday season and is later returned to the mom who made it. The downtown square has trees encircling it decorated by various groups and organizations in the area, such as 4-H, churches, schools, businesses etc.

At our November meeting, we all bring items to go in goody bags for the students. We sign up ahead of time, often at the Oct. meeting for the items we will bring as well as for a bag for the students. When we arrive at the Nov. meeting, the bags or buckets are usually lined up and we go down the line and fill them; each mom takes home the bags she has ordered for her student/s. Usually the bags are filled to overflowing, and our students are delighted with them. In order to take a bag home, the Mom must bring items for the bags. If she signs up for 2 bags, she brings at least two items for all the bags, etc.

In December, we don't have a regular meeting, but on the appointed night, those who would like to, meet at the town square to decorate the club's Christmas tree, and then often go out for dinner at a local restaurant.

In January and February, we spend a lot of our meeting time, planning and preparing for our annual HOWDY dinner fundraiser. Our Howdy Dinner and Dance (new this year) was held on March 5, 2016. It was a fajita dinner with much of the food prepared by members, and some purchased as well. We had a live and silent auction with items donated by members or area businesses. We recognize the oldest Aggie among us with a small gift and were gifted with a donation by the area Texas A&M Club, who we help with Muster as well. After dinner, there was a band and country western dancing was enjoyed by many. We had 200-300 attendees at the event. Tickets are sold ahead of time by members and at a few local businesses.

Last year and this year we have/will participated in Boutique at Parents' Weekend. We began selling Aggie Tote Bags purchased from Double D Ranchwear's collegiate division, Reds Rabbit, and we will sell those again this year along with some complementary items. We will add Snap Jewelry to our sales inventory this year, which is something new; we hope it will be well received. In April we also select our scholarship recipients and hold a dinner in their honor.

We give approximately 20 \$500 scholarships to area students that we receive applications for locally. We also have an endowed scholarship at Texas A&M for a junior or above student, and we participate in the selection process for that individual as well.

In May we honor our senior students at an ice cream social that our students are invited to attend with us, if they are home.

Last May 2015 NETC gave out \$100 to 8 organizations and 9 students received scholarships of varied amounts Club Events - September - Messina Hof - wine & chocolate pairings, October - Football Watching Party, November – 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Paint 'N Sip December – Kendra Scott, Lilly Pulitzer, & Vineyard Vines, shopping Bits & Bites, February – Casino Night Benefit Dinner, April – local Big Event, then lunch, May – Family Picnic

Programs for the year: staff from Carpooling, General Ramirez, Military Care Packages, Christmas Dinner with Ornament Exchange, Start Up Aggieland, Silver Taps & Muster, Rec Center, Academic Success Center, and Officer Induction with Troie Burch. Also we took Goody Bags down to College Station twice a year with homemade bake goods.

#### 42) Northwest Harris County Texas A&M Mothers' Club

The Northwest Harris County Texas A&M Mothers' Club meets on the second Tuesday of every month at the Houston Distributing Company. We have a social time from 6:30-7:00 and our meeting starts at 7:00. ### 48) San Angelo Texas A&M University Mothers' Club

Our club has 95 members supporting 63 students. This past fiscal year (2015-2016), our club awarded eight \$1,000 scholarships to outstanding students from our area. We also supported 10 student organizations, selected by our membership, with a \$100 donation to each organization. Each semester, we support our members' students by assembling Goody Bags, providing tutorial "Study Bucks" (up to \$100 in vouchers for tutorials), and mailing \$5 gift cards to support our students during Finals Week. #### 49) Sandstorm A&M University Mothers' Club

The Sandstorm Aggie Mom's Club in Odessa, TX meets once per month on the first Monday of the Month from September through May, however we meet on the last Monday in August instead of on Labor Day. We meet to network with each other, support each other, and support our students. We try to find the families of new student to provide support to them. We are continually looking for more and better ways to put out the word to our community that Texas A&M is the university to attend.

We start our year by hosting a summer social for the new A&M students and their families. Last June we had a hamburger cookout and swim party and over 40 people attended. #### 51) Southwest Dallas County Aggie Moms

The Southwest Dallas County Aggie Moms' Club currently has 41 members and one Adopt-a-Mom. This year marks the 27<sup>th</sup> year of our club, which was organized in 1988. We meet on the first Tuesday of the month from September through May. After the Howdy Party in July to welcome our new and returning Aggies, the SWDC Aggie Moms began a full calendar of events. Monthly programs this year were geared more toward welcoming new moms (half our club are freshman moms this year) and providing them with information on life as an Aggie. The fundraisers this year include Pampered Chef, Avon, Chili's Gives Back and Parents' Weekend Boutique. All proceeds from our fundraisers go to the Scholarship Fund. We award incoming freshman book scholarships and continuing student scholarships. We also donate to a TAMU campus organization as determined by the Executive Board in April.

We support our student Aggies through Exam Packs at the end of each semester, Halloween goodie bags, Valentine goodies and Aggie Brags at each meeting. Graduating seniors are recognized at the May meeting with a ring crest paperweight.

#### 52) Fort Worth/Tarrant County Aggie Moms' Club

As of February 2016, the Fort Worth/Tarrant County Aggie Moms Club has 183 members. Established in 1922, we celebrated our 93rd<sup>d</sup> year as a club this past October. Each year the club President chooses the club's logo and motto for the year with T-shirts made reflect that logo – this year's logo is shown above with the motto "Deep in the Heart of Aggies", because as moms we all hope to hold a special place deep in the heart of our young Aggie students.

#### Scholarships and Donations

For the 2015-16 school year, our Aggie Moms' Club raised funds to provide \$10,000 in scholarships and \$3,000 in donations to Texas A&M student organizations. With 127 scholarship applications received, our Scholarship Committee had a tough job choosing just 10 scholarship recipients. Scholarships were awarded in the amount of \$1,000 each, with six (6) awarded to current Texas A&M undergraduate students, and four (4) awarded to incoming freshmen students. Donations were made to eight (8) campus student organizations this year, in amounts ranging from \$250 to \$1000. These donations were made to: CARPOOL; Big Event, Fish Camp, Traditions Council, Corps of Cadets, Be the Match, Legacies, and Alpha Chi Omega (specified for domestic violence project).

#### Fundraising

Funds for scholarships and donations to student organizations are mainly derived from our boutique sales during Parents Weekend at Texas A&M. During this time we sell both craft items and merchandise. Throughout the year we also sell boutique items at Coach's Night, Howdy Party, general meetings, and special events. Other fundraisers this year include our annual Silent Auction & Chili Cook-off in February, and two Kendra Scott Gives Back nights, one held in November in Fort Worth location, and a second to be held in April in Southlake, where 20% of sales for a 2-3 hour period are donated by Kendra Scott.

#### Welcome for New Students & Parents

We began the new club year with the annual Howdy Party to welcome incoming freshmen and their families, held this year on July 12, 2015 at the Texas A&M School of Law. We had over 160 students and parents in attendance to hear from our own Aggie Moms and current students, the Yell Leaders, representatives from CARPOOL, Student Services and Texas AgriLife Extension. As an added bonus, in August we coordinated with Texas AgriLife Extension for a money management seminar for college students, entitled #Outof\$\$\$PleaseSentMore!, with approximately 20 students attending.

### Meetings and Events

The FW/TC Aggie Moms' club meets monthly from September to May, and offers a variety of special events throughout the year. We kicked off our programs in September with a presentation from Texas A&M's Office of Student Life, in October we learned about the Veterans Resource and Support Center, November provided information on the Study Abroad program, and December found us back at the Law School for a fun Holiday Mixer and ornament exchange. In January we welcomed Alyssa Michalke, first female Commander of the Corps of Cadets, and in March we will meet at the Texas A&M Law School and have the Law School's Dean Andrew Morris as our speaker. At each general meeting we have a themed potluck dinner at the start and offer boutique items for sale. Our February meeting is our annual Chili Cook-off and Silent Auction. This scholarship fundraiser has become a favorite for our moms, spouses and Aggie friends to attend, raising over \$5,000 this year through silent auction bidding, 50/50 Cash raffle and a Heads or Tails game for a television. We were also pleased to have Federation President Troie Burch as one of our Chili-Cook-off judges this year!

Aside from our monthly meetings, we hold several other activities and event opportunities for our members - in June we painted wine glasses at Blue Mesa in Fort Worth, in October we tasted wine and chocolates at Messina Hof in Grapevine, in November, in conjunction with the FW/TC A&M Club, we hosted a Game Watching Party at Fox & Hound in Fort Worth, and in February we painted the Aggie Barn at "Paint & Sip with Friends" in Colleyville. April 2<sup>nd</sup> will bring us our Big Event Luncheon, which honors our club's Past Presidents and helps out our community just like our students are doing the same Saturday in College Station at Texas A&M's Big Event. The luncheon features individual themed tables hosted by club members, and attendees at each table are asked to donate different items of need (such as shampoo, detergent, snack bars, etc.) in support of the Ronald McDonald House of Fort Worth – our own Big Event! In September, we provided water and a snack to 2,000+ members of the Corps of Cadets after the March In in Downtown Fort Worth, and in October and January we prepared and served a lunch meal to 50+ people staying at the Ronald McDonald House, Fort Worth. We also supported several Texas A&M organizations, collecting funds for MSC LEAD's Whoop For Troops boxes, collecting and delivering canned goods donations for 12thCan campus food pantry, and facilitating drop off of member's donations to the new Career Closet at A&M.

## Participation in Federation Activities

Our club has participated in many Federation activities this year, including having 13 members attend the 2015 Aggie Moms' Camp, with several serving as Camp staff and counselors. We had many moms attend the Fall and Winter dinner, workshops and meetings, and had all of 5 of our delegates present to vote at both business meetings. We have 5 Board members signed up to attend our upcoming District 1 meeting at the end of February.

The Fort Worth/Tarrant County Aggie Moms' Club continues to carry on the traditions and purpose that began 93 years ago - to foster and support fellow Aggie moms in the Tarrant County area, help out our students in Aggieland, enrich the Tarrant County community with our scholarships and donations, and represent the selfless service and support that is the true spirit of all Aggie Moms. It has been a pleasure to serve as the 2015-16 President of this great group of women! Gig'em Aggie Moms!

# 53) Tri-County Texas A&M Mother's Club

Our Tri-County Aggie Mom's Club is 18 years old and we have a membership of 98 ladies for the 2015-16 year. Our meetings are held in LaGrange, TX at the First United Methodist Church on the third Monday of each month. We share a meal, have fantastic guest speakers, share prayers, brag about our Aggies and have door prizes. Some of the speakers we have had this year include the Treasurer of Maroon Out, Members of the Maroon Coats, including the Student Body President, Dr. Musoma from the Mays Business School, and the voice of the Aggies, Dave South (who will be coming in April).

To kick off the year in August, we had a Howdy Party at the Texas Czech Heritage Center with a meal supplied by the club officers. New moms and returning moms played a Bingo game to get to know each other and to win small prizes. In December, we held our Christmas celebration at the Czech Center as well. Our moms and their spouses shared appetizers and our favorite libations. This year we played a fun ornament exchange game and each of the moms went home with a new ornament for her tree.
