

FEDERATION'S ANNUAL REPORT OF CLUBS 2020-2021

Abilene Texas A&M University Mothers' Club: President: Caren Christian

The Abilene A&M Mothers' Club had 33 members for the 2020-2021 year. This was a low membership for us which we attribute to the Covid-19 Virus. However, we were able to have all of our meetings in person this year by asking our members to wear masks. Our fundraising efforts enabled us to award two \$1000 scholarships to students in our area, as well as six \$100 book scholarships. We also donated \$100 to four separate student organizations. The organizations receiving these donations included Sisterhood of Aggie Mentors (SAM), Impact Retreat, Active Minds, and Brotherhood of Aggie Mentors (BAM). Graduating seniors were honored with a ring crest with his/her year of graduation.

In July, we hosted a HOWDY Party, inviting new Aggies and their parents to come meet one another and begin forming their own Aggie network. We had a panel of current Aggies answer questions for our new Aggies. Special guest speaker and Combined Band Drum Major for the Fightin' Texas Aggie Band, Kyle Medlock '21, shared about his experience as a Fightin' Texas Aggie and member of the Corps of Cadets. While the students meet separately from the parents, the board members shared their own words of wisdom and advice with the new Aggie parents and had our own question and answer session.

At our meetings this year, we heard from several former students who shared how their Aggie experience has shaped their lives and prepared them for success: Blake Howard, Ted and Alycin Evans, Laro Clark, and David Young.

In November and April, we put together BTHO Finals Survival Kits for our Aggies.

In December, we met at Abilene Axe Throwing for a fun time of fellowship with our Aggies. Our February meeting, for maybe the first time in club history, had to be cancelled due to the ice storm that came through Texas. In March we double dipped and made up our Boutique donations drive while also hosting a guest speaker.

We were able to reschedule our Zoom guests from February to April and enjoyed two of the Aggie Yell Leaders teaching us some Aggie Yells.

For Virtual Boutique this year, we raffled off an apartment set up with items "donated" by our members (they gave money for the items they wanted to buy for our Boutique chairs to then buy the items all at once for our winner). This was not as successful as we had hoped, but one of our local members won the drawing and decided to donate it all back to the club, so we had enough money to give our normal amount in scholarships.

We installed new officers in April and had our board transition meeting in May.

Alvin Texas A&M University Mothers' Club: President: Laura Dillon

The Alvin Aggie Mom's Club had 20 paid members for the 2020-2021 calendar year. We decided to have our meetings at various locally owned restaurants in the Alvin/Manvel area to help our small businesses recover from the COVID-19 shutdown. Through our various fundraisers, which included donations from a couple of our members for raffle items and a basket donated by CC Warehouse, plus hard work by all of our members, we were able to award scholarships to nine incoming Texas A&M students from Alvin and Manvel High Schools totaling \$4500. One of the main objectives of our club is to focus on being social, but of course, the pandemic got in the way. Our December meeting was in-person at a number of restaurants around Austin (including a number of Jack Allen's) so that members could spend time celebrating in small groups.

Fish Mom Meetings: In addition to Membership meetings, we also held our monthly Fish Moms meetings where our wonderful Fish mom committee taught our Fish Moms about many topics relating to being a parent of a Texas A&M student.

Socials: In September, we held a Drive Through Tailgate event to give new members a chance to pick up t-shirts, shop, sign up for committees, and buy goody bags. In addition to that, we held around 15 small group in person socials called 'Front Porch Socials' where we were sure to invite every single member of our club to a small group. We had a number of other socials including:

Socials: We started the fall with small group socials at people's homes – called 'Front Porch Socials'. These were well received. We had a number of other socials throughout the year. Fundraising: We were able to raise funds this year in a number of ways. We had our 'Howdy Club' of donations raised from club members. We had to cancel our Singing Cadets concert and had many of the Singing Cadet tickets we sold converted to donations. We had a great response to our Boutique in the fall and spring. Finally we held an online raffle in the fall and spring. The fall raffle was for one of our James Avery Bracelets, and the Spring Raffle was for an Aggie Ring – sponsored by the Bui Family.

Giving: Because of the generosity of our members, and the hard work of our Boutique/Raffle team, we were able to give at least a total of \$21,500 this year. The total will be determined when the Boutique and Raffle are over. Our giving includes: Veterans Endowed Scholarship: \$5000, Local Merit Scholarships: \$12,500, includes our Ring of Honor scholarship and Scherer family scholarship, J.J. Sanchez Leadership and Retention Cords for the Corp of Cadets: \$500, Association of Former Students (Graduation membership gift): \$500, Organizational Giving: at least \$3,000. This includes \$500 each to: Traditions Council, Veterans Resource Service Center, Texas Rising at Texas A & M, Aggieland Mariachi, Build, and Muster.

Austin County Texas A&M University Mothers' Club: President: Jonna Horak

Austin County A&M Mothers' Club had 41 members for the 2020-2021 year. Our fundraising efforts enabled us to award 8 \$500 scholarships to students in our area. Collin County Aggie Moms Annual Report 2020-2021

The Collin County Texas A&M University Mothers Club (Collin County Aggie Moms or CCAM) had 266 full members and 17 associate members for the 2020-2021 year.

Our fundraising efforts enabled us to award fourteen \$1000 academic scholarships to Collin County Aggies: twelve at College Station and two at Galveston. We currently have two Endowed Scholarships for \$1000 each. We also donated \$24,900 to 118 different on-campus Student Organizations. Our full members each have three votes on how we distribute our cash funds, and they selected organizations spanning both College Station and Galveston. A full list of these disbursements is posted on our website.

On May 17, 2021 we recognized our graduating/graduated seniors ($^{20} - ^{21}$) with a class year Aggie Ring Crest paperweight.

In Summer 2020, the pandemic statewide restrictions led us to host nearly all our events on Zoom. Our committee meetings were held on Zoom, to include many ByLaws revision committee meetings, and fundraiser planning. We hosted our Howdy Party on Zoom in August. Also, in September, we hosted a series of location-based Zoom small group meetings where we introduced new Aggie moms to seasoned Aggie moms in their areas. This resulted in several small groups bonding for individual small gatherings, later.

At our September General Membership meeting, we hosted Andy Duffie '78, founder of The Century Tree project. Andy explained the origins of his project, his many endowed scholarships, and how purchasing one of his Century Tree seedlings benefits nonprofits, too.

Andy facilitated our presentation of a Century Tree 2-year seedling to the family of Carly Beatty '22, in memory of the first anniversary of her death. Andy passed away in November, so our memory of this meeting is especially poignant.

Our October General meeting hosted the Federation of Aggie Mothers' Alice Artman to discuss the online holiday Boutique scheduled for November. In November we were ecstatic to have Melanie Shankle '93, author, and humorist, join us – where she announced that she, too, is going to be an AGGIE MOM!

January's General meeting found us hosting the Associate Dean and Director of the Medical Sciences Library at TAMU, Stephanie Fulton '91. This was a fascinating discussion and led to several good questions. February's General Meeting, also on Zoom, was Dr. Daniel and Denice Pugh Jr. to chat about being Aggie Parents, and what is going on at Texas A&M. Our March General Meeting, on Zoom, was what we called "housekeeping"... we presented our revised ByLaws, and our slate of nominated officers for the 2021-2022 CCAM board.

Our 2nd Annual Golf Tournament was held on April 15th, at Hurricane Creek Country Club, and was successful. The General Membership meeting on April 19th found us back on Zoom with Mike Havel '76. Mike walked us through the conception, development, and execution of the enormous Aggie Ring in the plaza behind the Clayton Williams Jr. Alumni Center. It was so fascinating! He also explained to our club how the real Aggie Network, the Association of Former Students, functions, and all the benefits that are available to our Aggies.

Our board meetings began as exclusively Zoom, but as state pandemic restrictions eased, we moved to a hybrid model, with both Zoom and in-person available to our board. Our board meetings were held at Aggie owned Kelly's Craft Taverns in Frisco or Allen. We laugh, now, but the technical difficulties were legendary (we laughed, then, too).

We managed to hold every one of our traditional fundraisers and other events! Our board worked, tirelessly, on Zoom and the phone; in masks and full PPE, to pull off:

• Pecans fundraiser – online sales, pickup of over 3,000 lbs. of fresh shelled pecans, bagging, and distribution.

• Poinsettias fundraiser -- online sales, wrapping, logistics of safe pick up and distribution.

• Goody Bags – twice this year, our Goody Bags were made available for both fall and spring semesters with drop points in College Station and Collin County.

• Boutique – we decided not to put any capital into Boutique, because we were uncertain how things would shake out. Instead, our Boutique chairs focused on clearing existing inventory by hosting "pop up" Boutique at the outdoor pavilion near our storage locker facility.

• Our Aggie Moms Connecting and Aggie Angels committees planned several meetings, observing proper pandemic protocols, and those who attended had a great time.

• Since we were allotted two "raffles" last year, and had not used any, we held an impromptu raffle for an Aggie Tree. Using the \$100 Aggie Mom gift certificate from the Warehouse/MaroonU, with a donated white tree and other decorations, we created nearly \$500 more revenue dollars!

• The 2020 spring fundraiser, a golf tournament set for March 2020, was postponed to July. So, our club basically held TWO golf tournaments in nine months.

Our club year started under the cloud of the pandemic, and there were many difficult moments, but we persevered and overcame every obstacle. Our love for all the Aggies, and for this University, drove us – our friendships sustained us.

"Challenging Covid Year"

One of our club's tradition's each year is to design a new logo for the club created by the President which represents her theme for the upcoming year. This year's theme was "Supporting Students from Cowtown to Aggieland since 1922". I wanted to recognize our Fort Worth Culture and the long history of support provided to our Aggies. I was very excited to lead our club into our 98th year as the 2nd oldest club despite starting in the midst of the pandemic without a major product vendor and multiple Board Positions unfilled. This meant constant planning changes based on the everchanging current Covid conditions and juggling multiple roles along with President. Our normal meeting location at the TAMU School of Law was now being used as class space so we had to find alternative meeting venues for the entire club year. Summer board meetings were held on outdoor patios and then on Zoom while member meeting spaces were sought out to handle the 50% social distancing capacity under Covid safety guidelines as we really wanted to make those valuable connections with our local Aggie Moms.

Membership

We moved our memberships online this year which was already planned prior to Covid but proved invaluable as social distancing became norm and in person gatherings were always questionable. This also helped increase membership in 2020-21 by over 40% to 179 from 127 the previous year with the added convenience provided for our Moms. We promoted the benefits of membership highlighting member pricing for club t-shirts and study kits along with the 12% discount provided by Aggieland Outfitters, Maroon U and The Warehouse. Our goal was to offer member meetings programs that would provide valuable information and resources to our Moms while fostering connections amongst one another to help increase membership too.

Howdy Party

Our Annual Howdy Party went from Plan A, to B, to C and then finally Plan D as an outdoor drive thru event on July 25, 2020 in the Texas A&M School of Law Howdy Parking Lot. We were excited to welcome over 50 carloads of incoming freshman, transfer students, law school students and their families coming from as far away as New Braunfels. We passed out bags of helpful information for new students, previewed our fall study kits, handed out cookies with cold bottles of water, sold club t-shirts and the latest fashion trend Aggie face masks, filled online pre-orders, handed out pre drawn door prizes, recognized our scholarship recipients, had a car side window meet and greet with the President and in car photo op! We also set up a Club Howdy Page for our new families to join, introduce their Aggies and start connecting a few weeks prior to the drive thru event. Our Board was also able to introduce themselves and their Aggies on this page too.

Monthly Member Meetings

We also celebrated our 98th Club Birthday during this meeting with a cake that was cut by our past presidents in attendance as usual tradition. For November's meeting we returned to Legal Draft and hosted John Comstock, the 13th Man from the Bonfire Collapse and also provided a video message from the Academic Success Center with helpful tips for Moms to share with their Aggies. December found us cancelling our in-person meeting with Covid numbers rising for a "Virtual Painting with a Twist" of the Aggie Barn. January brought another virtual meeting with the TAMU Career Center's Paul Pausky '78 to help our Aggies who were seeking jobs and internships. February's Meeting was cancelled due to the cold weather and power outages. March marked a return to in-person meetings with the Covid Vaccine being distributed now and Covid numbers easing. One Safe Place filled our need for a new alternative meeting space in Ft Worth, and Collin County Aggie Mom Angie Stooksberry Rogers shared her story of her son's unexpected death which led her establish the Aggie Recovery Group. April's Meeting Zoomed in Liz Schulz '19 from the TAMU Scholarship & Financial Aid Office to our in-person meeting. We also filled Spring study kits and voted to approve our updated Club Bylaws and our 2021-22 Club Elected Officers.

Each member meeting had themed potluck dinners with great food contributions from our Aggie Moms and was served in gloves by Ann our VP of Hospitality and her helpers for extra safety precautions. We also gave away a number of door prizes at each meeting that were contributed by myself and other board members.

Activities and Events

Due to Covid we did not do many extra activities, so we focused on our club's traditional events. Our Annual Chili Cookoff & Silent Auction normally held in February was postponed until late April.

Luckily our Big Event/Past Presidents Luncheon was able to be held in-person on March 27, 2021 in conjunction with the Big Event in College Station. As with all our events this year we made last minute decisions based on the current Covid conditions. Despite this last-minute planning and limited capacity with 30 attendees we raised approx \$500 for the Big Event CS from our Raffle Items and collected multiple donations on the House Needs List for our local Ronald McDonald House of Fort Worth. This luncheon featured beautiful individual themed tables hosted by some of our Board Members. We were honored to have Federation President Diane Eckols and VP of Districts Tamra Walker along with 11 Club Past Presidents in attendance. I asked each of our Past Presidents to share something about what made their year special with our attendees and to sign the back of the Club's Benjamin Knox Aggie Mom Print they each had the opportunity to display in their homes during their term as President.

Our Annual Chili Cook-off & Silent Auction Fundraiser has been a club favorite and was held on April 24, 2021 at Legal Draft in Arlington. We were very excited this year to feature the Aggie Wranglers who traveled from College Station for one of their few performances of the year! Our Judges were all Former Students with some pretty prestigious credentials. We awarded maroon monogrammed aprons to our 1st, 2nd, 3rd and People's Choice Award Winners in our Chili Cookoff with over 20 entries. We also raised almost \$3,000 from our Silent Auction and Raffles from this event and had a really good time in the process!

A new club tradition born out of Covid Cancelled Graduations in 2020 is our Member Grad Sign Celebrations. Our club purchased 50 signs last year at bulk pricing rate and approved to continue these celebrations moving forward for our Member's Grads. This is a very rewarding experience to connect with our Aggie Grads and welcome their Moms into Ring of Honor status. We also post each our Grad Celebrations on our Club's Facebook page to recognize their accomplishment! Our End of Year Celebration & Board Installation Dinner was held on May 18, 2021 at The Blue Mesa Grill offering a nice Fajita Buffet. We shared Aggie Mom & Senior Brags, recognized the outgoing 2020-21 Club Board Members and Installed the 2021-22 Club Board who took their oath. I was honored to receive the gavel for the 2nd year to continue some unfinished goals due to our challenging Covid year.

Our Ring of Honor Moms (moms of graduated Aggies) were limited on social events this Covid Year. We started out with a Virtual Howdy Hour in September catching up with one another and discussing ideas for the upcoming year. In October we met for dinner on the patio at Joe T Garcia's with a great turnout of 12 ROH Moms in attendance. November's Aggie Game Watch Party was cancelled over Covid concerns and ROH took a break for a few months. In March ROH Socials returned with Top Golf Night. Our club participated in The Federation's Fall, Winter and Spring Meetings and Workshops virtually as it was the only option this year with at least 4 delegates in attendance for each. We also had 4 Board Members attend ur District 1 Meeting in North Fort Worth hosted by Federation District Rep Tamera Walker in March where we shared ideas with other local clubs. Service and Donations for Community and Students

Our club also supports our local Aggies and our community. We delivered over 100 study kits full of snacks and other goodies both in the Fall and Spring before finals. Fall kits were filled and picked up by moms at our November meeting and Spring kits were filled at our April meeting and distributed to students in College Station. When A&M cancelled our normal on campus distribution location at the MSC we gained approval to distribute them at the H.E.B. parking lot on Wellborn. Aggie Moms will find a way to complete our mission one way or another! Our members also purchased extra study kits for the Veteran Students that I had the honor of delivering to the Veterans Resource Center for both semesters.

Our normal Ronald McDonald House of Fort Worth Service Opportunity of preparing and serving lunch twice a year was cancelled due to Covid so we passed the boot and collected over \$300 during our November Meeting for RMH to purchase meals for their families. Fundraising

The majority of our funds for scholarships and donations to student organizations are mainly derived from our boutique sales during Parents Weekend at Texas A&M and throughout the year including Fort Worth Coach's Night, Howdy Party, member meetings, and special events. Covid cancelled most of these opportunities for us and Aggie Moms Boutique was moved online for the Fall Holiday Boutique and the Spring Boutique. Our Online Boutique Sales brought in almost \$6,000 for the year while our Meeting Boutique Sales took in over \$2,500 for the year. We also tried something new by offering a Tamale Sale Fundraiser in the Fall that raised over \$800.

These funds added with our proceeds from the Silent Auction and the Big Event/Past Presidents Luncheon enabled us to provide \$10,000 in scholarships and donations to student organizations this year despite the many Covid cancellations and without a major product vendor too. Of these funds, \$8,000 will be awarded in scholarships to local students. Scholarships were recently approved in the amount of \$1,000 each, with five (5) awarded to current Texas A&M undergraduate students, and three (3) awarded to incoming freshmen students. Additionally, \$2,000 is slated for donations to Texas A&M student organizations in amounts ranging from \$250 to \$500 including The Big Event proceeds from our luncheon raffle.

Our Club's also has two fully funded Endowed Opportunity Award Scholarships at Texas A&M that were started in 1994 and 2015. These endowments in perpetuity provide an incoming freshman student a 4-year scholarship of \$1,250 per semester.

RECAP:

We have one Aggie moms' club for Louisiana with our membership spread all over the state. Our focus has been to support our Louisiana students throughout the year with gift cards and exam goody bags, awarding of scholarships when possible, hospitality towards student groups visiting Louisiana from Texas A&M, and fellowship/moral support for the parents with regional socials, a private Facebook page, and meetings over the internet using Zoom. Fall 2019:
