	<p>For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the Collin County Texas A&M University Mothers Club (Collin County Aggie Moms or CCAM) had 342 active members, 7 associate members, and 26 future members.</p> <p>The theme for the year was "Better Together" in hopes of becoming better mothers, women, caretakers, citizens, and friends. I wanted to answer the question of how we could do so in our community and as individuals—learning about self-care and fitness while learning what A&M offers our students.</p> <p>As a starting point, we met on May 20th to plan the upcoming 2023-2024 year at the Junior League of Collin County offices in Plano. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, most of our Board of Directors meetings were held at Caddo Building Conference Room #1, 8105 Rasor Blvd, Plano TX 75024 as the space was donated by a friend of the club. (Our December Board Meeting with Holiday Dinner was held at the Texas A&M AgriLife – Water Building due to a conflict at the Caddo Building.)</p> <p>We hosted our Howdy Party in July at the Texas A&M AgriLife – Water Building. Then, we hosted the New Moms Welcome in September. We continued to meet at the same location for our monthly General Meetings. The Texas A&M Extension Center were very generous in allowing us to use their space at 17360 Coit Rd, Dallas TX 75252.</p> <p>Starting in September, we began a series of Connecting Events for friendship and fellowship. The events varied from book club gatherings to brunch or dinners. These events were scheduled regularly and were ongoing through various locations within Collin County. The Aggie Angels Chair paired new Aggie moms with seasoned Aggie moms. They met at outings on a couple of occasions. The Ring of Honor Moms also congregated a few times.</p> <p>At our first General Meeting of the year in September, we hosted speaker Christy McDonald, Ed. D, M.S., LPC-S, on the topic of Mental Health & Suicide Awareness. The goal was to recognize the signs of suicide, bring awareness, and learn about the available resources.</p> <p>Our speaker for the October General Meeting was Dr. Jill Grimes '87 who wrote the book, College Student Health. Dr. Grimes highlighted topics in her book as well as reminding everyone that October is Breast Cancer Awareness month, and everyone should get screened. We handed out pink ribbons at the membership table to all attendees.</p> <p>For the November General meeting, we hosted a representative from the 12th CAN organization. They explained how their organization helps students and staff at Texas A&M with food insecurity. We also held a food collection benefitting the 12th CAN. Their representatives were able to drive the donations back to College Station. They shared that ours was the BIGGEST donation from an Aggie Mom Club.</p> <p>On Saturday, November 11th, Pecans that had been sold were unloaded and set-up for pick-up at the Texas A&M AgriLife—Water Building. \$12,817.00 in profits.</p> <p>The fall Goodie Bag order period allowed only members to purchase bags. The delivery occurred on December 1st in College Station. We delivered 160 Goodie Bag, which included an A&M picnic blanket, A&M clear drawstring sports bag, and snacks.</p> <p>General Meetings are not traditionally scheduled in December. Instead, we join the Dallas County Aggie Moms Club on December 2nd by selling boutique items during the Holiday Market. During this event, we also distributed Poinsettias that were pre-purchased. (Delivery, unloading, and set-up occurred the night before.) \$1,367.00 in profits.</p> <p>Due to inclement weather, the January General Meeting was cancelled. Since January is usually a low-attended meeting, we had planned a quick business meeting to be followed with a few rounds of Bunco as a fun meeting activity. The Boutique paid for three tables and Raffle had one. There was lots of planning and build-up leading up to this weekend as a few volunteers worked tirelessly creating handmade goods to sell in the Boutique, which had a net profit of \$3,957.00. Acquiring various Raffle items helped to make four unique baskets and a net profit of \$1,755.95. We made four people incredibly happy with their winnings—two males and two females, both of which were CCAM members! We presented them with their baskets during the April General Meeting.</p> <p>In April, speakers were not invited to our General Meeting. Instead, we held a short business meeting with Elections for 2024-2025, which was immediately followed by a few rounds of Bunco as a fun meeting activity.</p> <p>Our Annual Golf Tournament was held on April 25th, at Hurricane Creek Country Club, and was quite successful. San Antonio	<p>The San Antonio Aggie Moms' Club ended the 2023-2024 year with 290 paid members. Our various levels of membership include \$25 for Ring of Honor moms (moms of graduates), \$50 for regular membership (moms of current students), and two higher level memberships that include a tax-deductible monetary donation. Each year we publish a yearly directory. All members receive an electronic copy; hard copies are available for \$5.</p> <p>Each July, we invite incoming freshmen and transfer students to attend our Howdy Social with their parents at San Antonio's Aggie Park. Attendees enjoy hamburgers and hot dogs or ice cream (varies from year to year), Yell Practice led by the Galveston Yell Leaders, campus representatives who share information about their campus organizations, scholarship drawings, and door prize drawings. This year, about 100 students were in attendance; total attendance with family members was about 300 people.</p> <p>In August, we host our Corps Family Social for Corps parents and families to get to know one another and also to share information about the Corps of Cadets.</p> <p>Our monthly meetings are held the first Tuesday of each month during the school year, August to May (except January) at San Antonio's Aggie Park beginning at 6:30 p.m. Meetings include a simple dinner, speaker or activity, our boutique/Aggie Store, and Aggie mom camaraderie. A highlight of each meeting is our drawing for \$250 scholarships that go to current students and are distributed to each student's account through the Texas A&M Scholarships & Financial Aid Office. We give 11 of these \$250 scholarships throughout the year.</p> <p>Guest speakers at our meetings this year were KSAT Meteorologist Mia Montgomery '20; Al Pulliam '87, Jennifer Bohac '87 and Michael Osborn '21 from the Texas A&M Foundation; a mental health "panel" that included Federation President Johnna Lenamon; former astronaut and TAMU-Galveston COO Col. Mike Fossum '80; Corps of Cadets Commandant Brigadier General Patrick Michaelis '93; and best-selling author Melanie Shankle '93. Our December meeting is always fun because we recognize our December graduates, honor our former presidents, have a gift exchange, and spread holiday cheer.</p> <p>Our board meets monthly, usually the third Tuesday of the month, to organize and plan our upcoming meetings and events. Our board consists of both elected officers and appointed committee chairs. This year, 25 very talented and active moms held those positions.</p> <p>At the end of both the fall and spring semesters, we provided free goody bags to approximately 200 Aggies from San Antonio and Bexar County who attend the College Station and Galveston campuses as well as the Engineering Academy here in San Antonio.</p> <p>In April, the San Antonio A&M Club provided lunch for the Texas Aggie Band, Fish Drill Team, and Ross Volunteers after they marched in the annual Battle of the Flowers Parade, which is part of San Antonio's Fiesta celebration. Our club supported the A&M Club at this "Feed the Band" event by providing dessert in the form of 900 individual packages of mostly home-baked cookies and brownies to 450 cadets.</p> <p>At our last meeting of the year each May, we celebrate our May graduates, recognize our outgoing board, and install our incoming board.</p> <p>Perhaps our greatest accomplishment this year was fully funding our 17th Endowed Opportunity Award Scholarship. Through much fundraising, we were also able to begin funding our Centennial Gift Fund with the Texas A&M Foundation with the goal of raising \$100,000 for our Centennial celebration in 2026. Our fundraising efforts included poinsettia sales, profit-share days with local restaurants, "Sunday with Santa and Aggie Market Day," hosting a Singing Cadets concert, our full-scale Boots and Bling Gala in March, our Aggie Store throughout the year at our meetings, partnerships with two well-established businesses (Dos Road Dogs Coffee and Relentless Design LLC), Boutique at Family Weekend, Raffle at Family Weekend, and our membership drive with two donation levels.</p> <p>In addition to funding new endowed scholarships, we also donate to campus organizations that have helped us or with whom we have a special relationship. This year we gave almost \$6000 to 16 campus organizations.</p> <p>We put our new memorial gift program into action this year as we remembered 5 people who were very special to our club. We allowed the families to choose the campus organizations to donate \$250 to in their loved one's name. We also honored one special Aggie mom by awarding her an honorary lifetime membership in recognition of her many years of service to our club.</p>
Sandstorm	<p>We had a successful meeting each month, we made ornaments in December, family meal in January, gift cards twice a year for fall and spring finals and we do goodie boxes for Halloween and Valentine's Day.</p>
